

TERHARY EDUCATION SUBSIDY



TES is a grant-in-aid program under RA 10931 or Universal Access to Quality Tertiary Education Act given to qualified students enrolled in CHED-recognized public and private higher education institutions to support at least the partial cost of tertiary education, inclusive of education-related expenses.

It also provides access to quality tertiary education in city/town without state or local universities and colleges (SUCs/LUCs).









A SUBSIDY GRANT

For students enrolled in:



Private Schools Php 60,000



State and Local Universities and Colleges Php 40,000

Per Academic Year

Additional benefits for:



Persons with Disability Php 30,000 Per Year



Board/Licensure Exam Php 10,000 One-time reimbursement









- All enrolled Filipino undergraduate students
- **Higher Education Institution (HEI) and** the program are both CHED-recognized
 - State Universities and Colleges (SUCs)
 - Local Universities and Colleges (LUCs)
 - Private HEIs
- Not overstaying in the program (4 or 5+1 year grace period)















Students who are already beneficiaries of the Tulong Dunong Program (TDP), CHED Scholarship Programs (CSPs), and national government-funded StuFAPs

For student-applicants under the PNSL category, those who are not residing in the city or municipality where the HEI is located

Applicants who submitted falsified documents







PRIORITIZATION TES CATEGORY

- Continuing TES student-grantees including existing ESGPPA beneficiaries
- Students residing and studying in Private HEIs in cities/municipalities with no existing State and Local Universities and Colleges (PNSL)
- Students who are part of the DSWD's Listahanan 2.0, ranked according to household per capita income
- Other poor students not in the Listahanan 2.0, ranked according to household per capita income based on the proof of income documents to be determined by the UniFAST Board

*Prioritization is subject to availability of funds









STEP



Once enrolled for the 1st Semester of an Academic Year, a student coordinates with the TES Focal Person of the HEI to ensure that their name and correct information is included in the list of applicants to be submitted in the TES Online Portal.




The TES Focal Person submits applicants' information into the TES Online Portal to undergo the Nationwide Assessment (name matching and ranking based on the prioritization and availablity of funds).







DOCUMENTARY REQUIREMENTS











THE PROCESS OF TES APPLICATION

UniFAST releases the TES grants 10 through the Landbank Mastercard Prepaid Card (LMPC) or HEI



UniFAST Secretariat calls for TES Application in HEIs



HEI TES Focal collects and uploads the information of applicants into the **UniFAST Online Portal** within the submission period

Based on the masterlist, the HEI submits billing documents to CHEDRO in order to process the payment of TES grants





UniFAST Secretariat conducts a nationwide assessment to determine the qualified applicants

UniFAST Secretariat reviews and issues the official masterlist of new TES grantees to HEIs through CHEDRO





HEI informs qualified applicants to submit the documentary requirements

UniFAST Regional Coordinators verify and validate the documents submitted to identify the new TES grantees







5 **Qualified applicant submits** documentary requirements to HEI

HEI submits the documentary requirements to CHED Regional Office (CHEDRO) to proceed with the verification and validation process
