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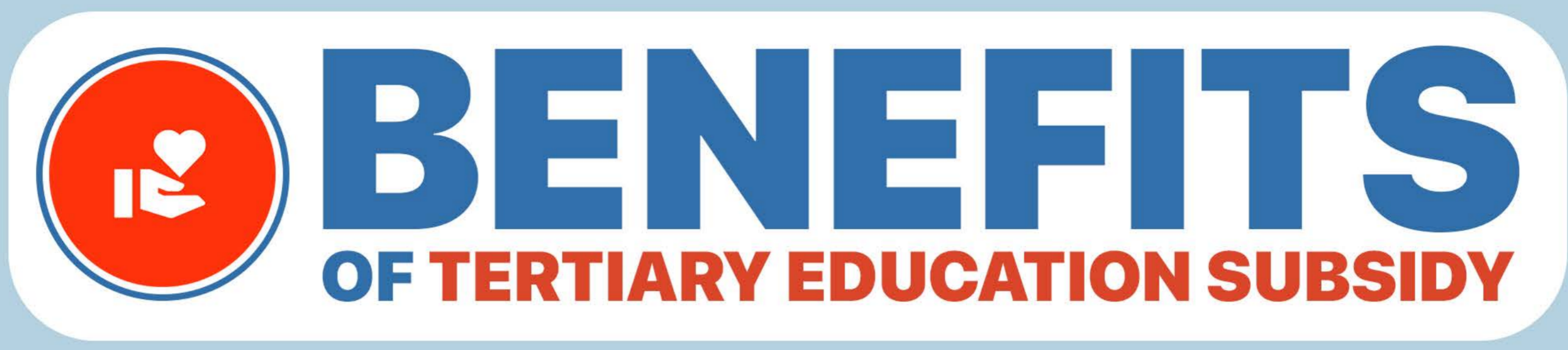
# TERTIARY EDUCATION SUBSIDY



**TES** is a **grant-in-aid program** under **RA 10931** or **Universal Access to Quality Tertiary Education Act** given to qualified students enrolled in CHED-recognized public and private higher education institutions to support at least the partial cost of tertiary education, inclusive of education-related expenses.

It also provides access to quality tertiary education in city/town without state or local universities and colleges (SUCs/LUCs).

# ELIGIBILITY



**All enrolled Filipino undergraduate students**



**Higher Education Institution (HEI) and the program are both CHED-recognized**

- State Universities and Colleges (SUCs)
- Local Universities and Colleges (LUCs)
- Private HEIs



**Not overstaying in the program  
(4 or 5+1 year grace period)**





# INELIGIBILITY

## FOR NEW TES APPLICANTS



**Foreign citizens**



**Non-students**



**Students enrolled in HEIs or programs not included in the CHED Registry of Programs and Institutions**



**Students already in their 2<sup>nd</sup> undergraduate post-secondary program**



**Students who are already beneficiaries of the Tulong Dunong Program (TDP), CHED Scholarship Programs (CSPs), and national government-funded StuFAPs**



**For student-applicants under the PNSL category, those who are not residing in the city or municipality where the HEI is located**



**Applicants who submitted falsified documents**

## PRIORITIZATION CATEGORY

1

Continuing TES student-grantees including existing ESGPPA beneficiaries

2

Students residing and studying in Private HEIs in cities/municipalities with no existing State and Local Universities and Colleges (PNSL)

3

Students who are part of the DSWD's Listahanan 2.0, ranked according to household per capita income

4

Other poor students not in the Listahanan 2.0, ranked according to household per capita income based on the proof of income documents to be determined by the UniFAST Board

***\*Prioritization is subject to availability of funds***



# HOW TO APPLY

## FOR THE **TES PROGRAM**

### STEP



Once enrolled for the 1st Semester of an Academic Year, a student coordinates with the TES Focal Person of the HEI to ensure that their name and correct information is included in the list of applicants to be submitted in the TES Online Portal.

### STEP



The TES Focal Person submits applicants' information into the TES Online Portal to undergo the Nationwide Assessment (name matching and ranking based on the prioritization and availability of funds).
